COURSE INFORMATION

The Health Services and Nursing qualifications outlined in this brochure have been designed to ensure that students develop the required theoretical knowledge and practical skills to provide high levels of Nursing care within a health care setting.

Each of the qualifications provides students opportunities for practical learning, both in a simulated and real work environment.

Graduates will possess the required competence to meet workplace demands in a health care setting.

COURSE DELIVERY & ASSESSMENT METHODS

HLT33115 Certificate III in Health Services Assistance

Delivery of this program is face to face for 20 hours per week, across 36 weeks in total - including 120 hours of Clinical Placement.

HLT54115 Diploma of Nursing

Delivery of this program is face to face for 20 hours per week, across 78 weeks in total - including 400 hours of Clinical Placement offered in 4 distinct blocks.

Assessment methodology for these qualifications, may include but is not limited to tests and examinations, classroom and simulation participation, case studies, clinical placement assessment, essays, role plays, group assessments and presentations.

Students are expected to bring their own computers/laptops to classes.

STUDY PATH

Training is delivered in stages which correspond to Australian Quality Framework (AQF) Levels III and V. The preferred pathway for a qualification is for students to complete the requirements of the previous level qualification before progressing to the next level – thereby achieving more than one qualification.

Direct entry into the Diploma of Nursing is possible.

We aim to equip our graduates with the necessary skills and knowledge to enable them to successfully satisfy the demands of the workplace.

ACADEMIC YEARS / START DATES

There are 40 teaching weeks per annum with the year divided into 4 terms of 10 weeks each. The academic year begins in late January and ends mid December. Intakes are at the beginning of each term.

DEMAND FOR NURSES

The Health Sector in Australia has a need for 109,000 new Nurses to join the workforce by 2025 (Health Workforce 2025 Report).

The Diploma of Nursing is the minimum requirement to become registered as an Enrolled Nurse in Australia.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Certificate III

- International applicants must be 18 years or older
- Year 11 or equivalent certificate of senior secondary education
- IELTS (Academic) score of 6.0 with no band score less than 5.5 (or equivalent). If the level of English is insufficient, a suitable course can be organised

Note: To be eligible to continue to the Diploma level, applicants must show that they have achieved an IELTS (Academic) score of 7.0 in reading, writing, listening and speaking by the end of the Certificate III level.

Diploma

- International applicants must be 18 years or older
- Year 11 or equivalent certificate of senior secondary education
- If the level of English is insufficient, a suitable course can be organised
- IELTS Academic (or equivalent) score of 7.0 with no band score less than 7.0

Notes:

- The IELTS test results can be
 - In one test sitting; or
 - A maximum of two test sittings within a six-month period only if:
 - Applicants achieved a minimum overall IELTS (Academic) score of 7.0 in each sitting; and
 - Applicants achieved a minimum IELTS (Academic) score of 7.0 in each component across two test sittings; and
 - no band score less than 6.5 (or equivalent).if the level of English is insufficient, a suitable course can be organised

- To be eligible to register as an Enrolled Nurse, applicants must provide evidence to the Nurses and Midwifery Board Australia to show that they have achieved an IELTS (Academic) score of 7.0 in reading, writing, listening and speaking which has been achieved in one sitting and is no more than 2 years old.
